
We will be better prepared

A story of community disaster preparedness





There has been heavy rain for two days. If it continues, the river could flood our home. We need to get ready in case we need to evacuate.




What should we do?

Two days later




warning more rain... floods!

Son, remember we decided you would help Uncle Amando get to the evacuation centre. He has trouble walking and no family to help him.











We will take the route we decided on during our disaster risk reduction meetings. There are no hazards like flooded streams that way.















Evacuation bag checklist

If you live in a disaster-prone area, keep a bag packed and ready to take with you if you have to quickly evacuate your home

The bag should contain:



At the first indications of a possible disaster, such as unusually heavy rain, pack the other things you need to take when you evacuate, such as:



Important documents such as birth certificates, ID cards and passports, house registration papers and bank pass books



Your medicine



Money



Children's school books
